Utah Rider Brings Home Reining Horse Championship

Oklahoma City, Oklahoma – December 6, 2014: Lara Oles of Heber City won the inaugural Para Reining Championship at the 2014 National Reining Horse Association Futurity in Oklahoma. She rode Western Wiz, a 12 year old quarter horse owned by Bob Thompson of Alberta, Canada. The Para Reining class featured physically disabled riders from all over the United States and Canada.

Reining is a western style of riding where horse and rider must accurately perform a series of circles, spins and stops. Reining began in the United States, but has become popular around the world. Oles spent the week before at a Para Reining Clinic conducted by Lisa Coulter, a professional reining rider and trainer. Coulter donated her time, effort, and horses to instruct the participants in para reining.



Oles is well known in the Utah horse community as a determined competitor and as the state's first internationally classified Para Dressage rider. Oles was in a freak skiing accident in 2006 that damaged her spinal cord, leaving her right arm permanently paralyzed and stroke-like symptoms in her right leg.

Currently dressage is the only Para Equestrian sport at the Paralympics. Oles hopes that reining will be added as a Paralympic sport in the future. Her ultimate goal is to represent the United States at the 2016 Summer Paralympics to be held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.
